PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION ORDER

Plaintiff HONG KONG LEYUZHEN TECHNOLOGY CO. LIMITED (“[PLAINTIFF]”) filed a Motion for Entry of a Preliminary Injunction against the against the fully interactive, e-commerce stores¹ operating under the seller aliases identified in Schedule A to the Complaint and attached hereto (collectively, “Defendants”). After reviewing the Motion and the accompanying record, this Court GRANTS [PLAINTIFF]’s Motion as follows.

This Court finds [PLAINTIFF] has provided notice to Defendants in accordance with the Temporary Restraining Order entered April 21, 2025, [DOCKET NO. 19] (“TRO”), and Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65(a)(1).

This Court also finds, on a preliminary basis, that Defendants have engaged in the unauthorized use and display of Plaintiff’s federally registered copyrights VA0002382152 and VA0002384843 (the “Plaintiff’s Copyrights”).

This Court also finds that the injunctive relief previously granted in the TRO should remain in place through the pendency of this litigation and that issuing this Preliminary Injunction is warranted under Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65. Evidence submitted in support of this Motion and in support of PLAINTIFF's previously granted Motion for Entry of a TRO establishes that PLAINTIFF has demonstrated a likelihood of success on the merits; that no remedy at law exists; and that PLAINTIFF will suffer irreparable harm if the injunction is not granted.

Specifically, PLAINTIFF has proved a prima facie case of copyright infringement because (1) PLAINTIFF is the lawful assignee of all right, title and interest in and to the federally registered copyright(s), and (2) Defendants market products using images that infringe directly and/or indirectly PLAINTIFF'S federally registered copyrights. Furthermore, Defendants' continued, and unauthorized use of PLAINTIFF'S federally registered copyrights irreparably harms PLAINTIFF through loss of customers' goodwill and reputational harm. Monetary damages fail to address such damage and, therefore, PLAINTIFF has an inadequate remedy at law. Moreover, the public interest is served by entry of this Preliminary Injunction to dispel the public confusion created by Defendants' actions. Accordingly, this Court orders that:

1. Defendants, their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all persons acting for, with, by, through, under, or in active concert with them be preliminarily enjoined and restrained from using or displaying the Plaintiff's Copyrights, in any medium, whether it be print, digital or otherwise

2. Upon PLAINTIFF's request, Defendants and any third party with actual notice of this Order who is providing services for any of Defendants, or in connection with any of Defendants' Online Marketplaces, including, without limitation, any online marketplace platforms such as eBay, Inc., AliExpress, Alibaba Group Holding Ltd. ("Alibaba"), Amazon.com, Inc., ContextLogic Inc. d/b/a Wish.com ("Wish.com"), and Dhgate (collectively, the "Third Party Providers"), shall, within seven (7) calendar days after receipt of such notice, provide to PLAINTIFF expedited discovery, limited to copies of documents and records in such person's or entity's possession or control sufficient to determine:
 - a. the identities and locations of Defendants, their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and any persons acting in active concert or participation with them, including all known contact information and all associated e-mail addresses;
 - b. the nature of Defendants' operations and all associated sales, methods of payment for services, and financial information, including, without limitation, identifying information associated with the Online Marketplaces and Defendants' financial accounts, including Defendants' sales and listing history related to their respective Online Marketplaces; and
 - c. any financial accounts owned or controlled by Defendants, including their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and any persons acting in active concert or participation with them, including such accounts residing with or under the control of any banks, savings and loan associations, payment processors or other financial institutions, including, without limitation, PayPal, Inc. ("PayPal"), Alipay, Wish.com, Alibaba, Ant Financial Services Group ("Ant Financial"), Amazon Pay,

or other merchant account providers, payment providers, third party processors, and credit card associations (e.g., MasterCard and VISA).

3. Upon PLAINTIFF's request, those with notice of this Order, including the Third Party Providers as defined in Paragraph 4, shall within seven (7) calendar days after receipt of such notice, disable and cease displaying any advertisements using the PLAINTIFF Copyrights.
4. PLAINTIFF may provide notice of the proceedings in this case to Defendants, including service of process pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 4(f)(3), and any future motions, by electronically publishing a link to the Pleadings, this Order, and other relevant documents on a website and by sending an e-mail with a link to said website to the e-mail addresses provided for Defendants by third parties. The Clerk of the Court is directed to issue a single original summons in the name of "THE INDIVIDUALS, CORPORATIONS, LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANIES, PARTNERSHIPS AND UNINCORPORATED ASSOCIATIONS IDENTIFIED IN SCHEDULE "A" HERETO" that shall apply to all Defendants. The combination of providing notice via electronic publication and e-mail, along with any notice that Defendants receive from payment processors, shall constitute notice reasonably calculated under all circumstances to apprise Defendants of the pendency of the action and afford them the opportunity to present their objections.
5. All previous Sealed Plaintiff's Pleading(s) and documents in this case are unsealed.
6. Any Defendants that are subject to this Order may appear and move to dissolve or modify the Order as permitted by and in compliance with the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure

and the Northern District of Illinois Local Rules. Any third party impacted by this Order may move for appropriate relief.

7. The \$3,000.00 bond posted by PLAINTIFF shall remain with the Court until a final disposition of this case or until this Preliminary Injunction is terminated.
