**ORDER EXTENDING TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER
AND SCHEDULING HEARING**

THIS CAUSE came before the Court on Plaintiff Toho Co., Ltd.'s Motion for Preliminary Injunction (the "Motion") (DE [33]), filed on August 12, 2025. The Court has reviewed the Motion and is otherwise advised in the premises.

In addition to its request for a preliminary injunction, Plaintiff seeks an extension of the Temporary Restraining Order, which the Court docketed on August 4, 2025, and is set to expire on August 18, 2025. See (DE [30]). Plaintiff bases its request on allowing "ample time for Defendant to oppose the Motion and for the Motion to be heard. . ." (DE [33] at p. 6). As of the filing of Plaintiff's Motion, Defendant has been served but has not yet appeared or responded to the Amended Complaint. See (DE [31]). Therefore, the Court finds good cause to extend the Temporary Restraining Order for fourteen days, in addition to setting a deadline for Defendant to oppose the instant Motion.


Accordingly, it is hereby **ORDERED AND ADJUDGED** as follows:

1. The Sealed Temporary Restraining Order and Asset Restraint Order (DE [30]), dated August 4, 2025, is hereby extended and shall remain in effect until the date of the hearing on the Motion for Preliminary Injunction set forth below.

2. A **telephone hearing** is set before this Court on **August 28, 2025, at 1:00 P.M.**, at which time Defendants and/or any other affected persons may challenge the appropriateness of the Temporary Restraining Order and move to dissolve it, and at which time the Court will hear argument on Plaintiff's requested preliminary injunction. Counsel for all parties should use the following dial-in information: **Telephone Number: 833-435-1820; Access Code: 998147.**

3. Any response or opposition to Plaintiff's Motion for Preliminary Injunction must be filed and served on Plaintiff's counsel **within 7 days of the date of this Order**. Plaintiff shall file any Reply Memorandum **within 5 days of the date of service of any response or opposition**. The above dates may be revised upon stipulation by all parties and approval of this Court. Defendants are hereby on notice that failure to appear at the hearing may result in the imposition of a preliminary injunction against them under 15 U.S.C. § 1116(d), Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65, The All Writs Act, 28 U.S.C. § 1651(a), and this Court's inherent authority.
