**ORDER AUTHORIZING ELECTRONIC SERVICE AND EXPEDITED DISCOVERY**

This matter is before the Court on Plaintiff Hong Kong Leyuzhen Technology Co. Limited’s (“Plaintiff”) Motion for Electronic Service and Expedited Discovery (the “Motion”) against THE INDIVIDUALS, CORPORATIONS, LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANIES, PARTNERSHIPS AND UNINCORPORATED ASSOCIATIONS, identified in Plaintiff’s “Schedule A” attached as Exhibit 2 to Plaintiff’s Complaint at Law (“Defendants”). After reviewing the Motion and the accompanying documents, and in the absence of adversarial presentation, this Court Grants the Motion as follows:

Plaintiff is the owner of certain Copyright Protected Images under the federal Copyright Registration Numbers: **VA0002379888, VA0002380491, VA0002381842, VA0002413181, VA0002413183, VA0002413190, VA0002413196, VA0002413200.** Attached as Exhibit 1 attached to Plaintiff’s Complaint.

Accordingly, this Court Orders as follows:

1. Plaintiff is authorized to issue expedited written discovery to Defendants, pursuant to Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 33, 34, 36, and 45 related to:

- a. the identities and locations of Defendants, their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and any persons acting in active concert or participation with them, including all known contact information and all associated e-mail addresses;
- b. the nature of Defendants' operations and all associated sales, including Defendants' sales and listing history related to their respective Online Marketplaces; and
- c. The domain name registries for the Defendants' Domain Names, including, but not limited to, VeriSign, Inc., Neustar, Inc., Afilias Limited, CentralNic, Nominet, and the Public Interest Registry, and the domain name registrars, including, but not limited to, GoDaddy Operating Company LLC, Name.com, PDR LTD. d/b/a/ PublicDomainRegistry.com, Cloudflare Inc., Oracle Corp., Amazon Inc., TikTok Group d/b/a TikTok, Cloud.com, Namesilo, LLC d/b/a privacuguardian.org, and Namecheap Inc., within seven (7) calendar days of receipt of this Order or prior to the expiration of this Order, whichever date shall occur first, shall disable the Defendants' Domain Names and make them inactive and untransferable until further ordered by this Court.

2. The Court authorizes Plaintiff to serve third-party discovery on an expedited basis, with responses due not less than 10 days after service. The requests shall be proportional to the immediate needs of the case. *See* Fed. R. Civ. P. 26(b)(1). For example, a request for "documents sufficient to show X" is better than a request for "all documents showing X." Plaintiff shall consider what documents it genuinely needs at this early stage, and shall take into account the burden on third parties. Plaintiff shall work cooperatively with third parties impacted by this Order and make reasonable, good faith efforts to ease the burdens imposed by Plaintiff's request for expedited discovery.

3. The Clerk of the Court is directed to issue a single original summons in the name of “The Individuals, Corporations, Limited Liability Companies, Partnerships and Unincorporated Associations Identified in Schedule A” that shall apply to all Defendants. The combination of providing notice via electronic publication and e-mail, along with any notice that Defendants receive from payment processors, shall constitute notice reasonably calculated under all circumstances to apprise Defendants of the pendency of the action and afford them the opportunity to present their objections.

4. PLAINTIFF may provide notice of the proceedings in this case to Defendants, including service of process pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 4(f)(3), and any future motions, by electronically publishing a link to the Complaint, this Order, and other relevant documents on a website and by sending an e-mail to any e-mail addresses provided for Defendants by third parties with the same documents. The combination of providing notice via electronic publication and e-mail, along with any notice that Defendants receive from payment processors, shall constitute notice reasonably calculated under all circumstances to apprise Defendants of the pendency of the action and afford them the opportunity to present their objections.

5. Any third party impacted by this Order may move for appropriate relief.
