TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

Plaintiff Shenzhen Peishi Advertising Media Co., Ltd. (“Plaintiff”) filed an *Ex Parte* Motion for Temporary Restraining Order, Including an Asset Restraint (the “Motion”) against XINBAOXUAN (“Defendant”), who operates at least one e-commerce store (the “Online Stores”) maintained on the Amazon marketplace platform (the “Platform”). After reviewing the Motion and the accompanying record, this Court GRANTS Plaintiff’s Motion in part as follows.

This Court finds, in the absence of adversarial presentation, that it has personal jurisdiction over Defendant because Defendant directly targets its business activities toward consumers in the United States, including Illinois. Specifically, Plaintiff has provided a basis to conclude that Defendant has targeted sales to Illinois residents by setting up and operating e-commerce stores that target United States consumers using one or more seller aliases, offer shipping to the United States, including Illinois, and have sold products using infringing versions of Plaintiff’s federally registered U.S. Patent No. 12,324,440 (the “’440 Patent”) to residents of Illinois. In this case, Plaintiff has presented photographic evidence of the Infringing Product that was shipped to Illinois along with a link to Defendant’s e-commerce store demonstrating that it is reaching out to do

business with Illinois residents by operating one or more commercial, interactive internet stores through which Illinois residents can and do purchase products using counterfeit versions of the ‘440 Patent. See Docket Nos. [1-2 and 2-2], which includes screenshot evidence confirming that the Defendant internet store does stand ready, willing, and able to ship its counterfeit goods to customers in Illinois bearing infringing and/or counterfeit versions of the versions of the automatic smoker claimed in the ‘440 Patent.

This Court also finds that issuing this Order without notice pursuant to Rule 65(b)(1) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure is appropriate because Plaintiff has presented specific facts in the Declarations of Jennifer Pantuso and the Declaration of Xiaoling Chen in support of the Motion and accompanying evidence clearly showing that immediate and irreparable injury, loss, or damage will result to the movant before the adverse party can be heard in opposition. Accordingly, this Court orders that:

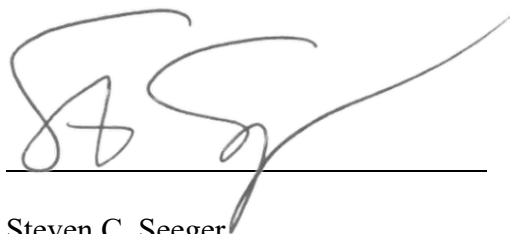
1. The Defendant, officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all persons acting in active concert or participation with them be temporarily enjoined and restrained from:
 - a. manufacturing, importing, offering to sell, or selling any product that infringes the ‘440 Patent;
 - b. aiding, abetting, contributing to, or otherwise assisting anyone in infringing upon the ‘440 Patent; and
 - c. Effecting assignments or transfers, forming new entities or associations, or utilizing any other device for the purpose of circumventing or otherwise avoiding the prohibitions set forth in Subparagraphs (a) and (b)
2. Plaintiff is authorized to issue expedited written discovery to Defendant, pursuant to Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 33, 34, and 36, related to:

- a. the identities and locations of the Defendant, their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and any persons acting in active concert or participation with them, including all known contact information and all associated e-mail addresses;
 - b. the nature of Defendant's operations and all associated sales, methods of payment for services, and financial information, including, without limitation, identifying information associated with the Online Marketplaces and Defendant's financial accounts, including Defendant's sales and listing history related to their respective Online Marketplaces; and
 - c. any financial accounts owned or controlled by Defendant, including their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and any persons acting in active concert or participation with them, including such accounts residing with or under the control of any banks, savings and loan associations, payment processors, or other financial institutions, including, without limitation, PayPal, Inc. ("PayPal"), Alipay, ContextLogic Inc. d/b/a Wish.com ("Wish.com"), Alibaba Group Holding Ltd. ("Alibaba"), Ant Financial Services Group ("Ant Financial"), Amazon Pay, or other merchant account providers, payment providers, third party processors, and credit card associations (e.g., MasterCard and VISA).
3. The Clerk of the Court is directed to issue a single original summons in the name of "XINBAOXUAN " and shall apply to the Defendant.
4. Plaintiff must provide notice to Defendant of any motion for preliminary injunction as required by Rule 65(a)(1).
5. Within seven (7) calendar days of entry of this Order, Plaintiff shall deposit with the Court Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00), either cash or surety bond, as security, which amount

has, in the absence of adversarial testing, been deemed adequate for the payment of such damages as any person may be entitled to recover as a result of a wrongful restraint hereunder.

6. The Defendant is subject to this Order may appear and move to dissolve or modify the Order as permitted by and in compliance with the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and the Northern District of Illinois Local Rules. Any third party impacted by this Order may move for appropriate relief.
7. This Temporary Restraining Order without notice is entered at 2:56 p.m. on this April 30, 2026 and shall remain in effect for 14 calendar days.
